The 400 FLY makes a bold mark by introducing the acclaimed Beach Mode to the 40-foot flybridge realm, a standout feature in its segment. Reflecting Galeon's fourth-generation design principles, it showcases expansive windows, sleek contours, and a modular interior focus. Across its three decks, it exudes a sporty silhouette and captivating aesthetics.

The flybridge commands attention, boasting an L-shaped seating and dining arrangement, accompanied by a double helm sport seat and a compact wet bar. An optional bimini top provides respite from the sun. Forward, an expansive sundeck with an innovative front seat adds an exhilarating dimension.

The Beach Mode, a highlight, dramatically expands the cockpit through drop-down sides, setting a new standard in space. The saloon transforms with sliding dividing doors, unveiling an inviting dinette. The versatile two-way backrest and pivoting double bench foster a seamless connection between the saloon and cockpit.

A hydraulic platform aft hosts al fresco relaxation, optionally accompanied by a transom bar featuring a grill, chopping board, sink, and drained cooler. Dual fold-out tables encourage open-air dining, accompanied by ample seating and shelter.

On the main deck, a harmonious C-shaped dinette and entertainment area coexist with the galley and helm at the fore. The kitchen's upper window slides for enhanced interior ventilation. Convenient sliding starboard doors facilitate mooring maneuvers.

Below, two guest cabins with private bathrooms ensure comfort for four. The midship master cabin features a vanity station and generous double bed. The bow VIP cabin accommodates with twin V-shaped beds.

Elevating on-deck functionality, refined finishes, and comprehensive design and performance, the 400 FLY triumphs as an unrivaled presence in its domain.

The fusion of a dynamic silhouette and sporty accents is enhanced by expansive windows on both decks, brightening the interior. Emphasizing practicality and accessibility, the design seamlessly integrates all outdoor spaces to accommodate passengers.

The top deck features a helm station complemented by a portside settee for a companion. The primary rest area is strategically positioned further back, enveloped by an L-shaped sofa surrounding an elongated table, comfortably seating six. A well-equipped wet bar complements the arrangement. On the main deck find two distinct leisure zones with the bow easily reachable via starboard sliding doors adjacent to the helm. The foldable bimini and front-facing seat offer additional protection from the elements

The cockpit is enhanced by a full-sized hydraulic stern platform and the innovative Beach Mode, featuring semi-glazed panels that drop down on both sides. This expansion of space during mooring invites guests to partake in activities such as diving, fishing, or sunbathing. The versatile bath platform doubles as a lift for water toys and conveniently grants access to the stern-facing grill area.

Internally, a classic layout unfolds, with the rest area thoughtfully positioned toward the rear, separated from the cockpit solely by sliding glass doors. The galley and helm station occupy a forward stance, while the cabins are situated on the lower deck.

Accommodating four passengers in comfort, the lower deck showcases a mid-ship master and a forward VIP, both with ample storage. For larger groups, a three-cabin layout featuring bunk beds is available. Both lower-level bathrooms are equipped with a head and shower, boasting standing height for added convenience.

The top deck encompasses a dual helm station and forward sundeck, complemented by seating and a wet bar. An optional carbon hardtop bimini provides respite from the sun. The main deck features a generously sized cockpit that extends through the unique Beach Mode, widening the usable area to an impressive six meters. Slide the glass doors to unveil a bar on the port side and extra seating opposite the kitchen.

Two cockpit options cater to different preferences: a 360-degree rotating sofa with a garage below or conventional seating with a crew cabin and bathroom. 

The 640 takes deck layout and space distribution innovation to unprecedented levels. The upper deck presents a complete bar, dual front-facing seating, and an expansive sundeck area featuring a generous U-shaped sofa. The carbon bimini, equipped with a retractable soft panel roof, provides sun coverage. Moving to the cockpit unveils one of the most capacious entertainment spaces in its class.

The Beach Mode impresses with balcony extensions widening the width to an impressive 7.4 meters, facilitating refreshment to both bars. The U-shaped cockpit settee, adaptable with a canvas for added privacy or for viewing TV on the concealed kitchen top screen, adds versatility. The aft hydraulic bath platform, grants easy entry to the skipper cabin. Innovative front entrance transforms the typically inaccessible bow into a hub with a convertible sundeck and seating area.

The main deck boasts an independent entrance to the master cabin and a distinct partition between the kitchen and the forward entertainment section. The dining space accommodates many and features an engaging pop-up TV on the opposing side. Below deck, three distinct layouts offer private bathrooms for each of the three master cabins. 





























The 680 aims to reign supreme as the ultimate luxury yacht in its class. From its eye-catching design featuring oversized side and hull windows, to its exceptional top deck and bow areas, this vessel is poised to become the ideal host for all your gatherings and events.

The top deck's expansive beam extends over the sides, accommodating a spacious C-shaped sofa that comfortably seats fifteen, along with a superb dining setup. At the forefront, a well-appointed bar stands ready to cater to evening parties. The driver benefits from twin sport seats, while guests can choose between the front dining area or the sprawling sundeck stretching up to the venturi windscreen. Crafted from carbon for structural integrity and weight reduction, the top structure maintains optimal stability and balance.

On the main deck, a C-shaped sofa envelops a teak table, all elegantly shaded by the flybridge overhang. Forward, the expansive sundeck can quickly transform into four separate seating zones, featuring twin dining tables that automatically rise when needed. The saloon boasts luxurious finishes and an abundantly illuminated interior.

Separated from the cockpit by foldable doors, the kitchen efficiently caters to both bars. Opposite, a choice between a second bar or a relaxation area is available, both benefiting from the remarkable slidedown windows on port and starboard sides.

Privacy is thoughtfully addressed through the layout of the main deck, which separates guest and master cabins with entrances at both the bow and midship.

Below deck, the master stateroom spans the yacht's entire beam, featuring large windows, a vanity station, and ample wardrobe space. Guest quarters encompass the bow VIP cabin and two twin cabins flanking both sides, each paired with an additional bathroom.





























At the forefront of innovation the 800 FLY boasts advanced navigation electronics and cutting-edge technologies, ensuring the safety and comfort of all passengers. Carbon fiber structural elements have allowed to expand the upper deck, featuring a double helmsman's position, a fully equipped bar, a sunbathing area, and four adaptable tables. Notably, two spacious semicircular sofas elegantly incorporate a jacuzzi between them.

On the main deck, interiors reminiscent of upscale apartments await. A lavishly equipped galley with a refined kitchen island beckons attention. Adjacent to the double helmsman's station is a comfortable sofa with a coffee table, accompanied by a grand table seating eight. The tastefully adorned living room boasts ample windows, a retractable TV, a modern bar, and a separate day toilet.

Amidships, the master cabin features a spacious central double bed and an adjacent walk-in wardrobe. Between the VIP and master cabins lie two guest cabins, each with twin beds that seamlessly convert into one.

The 425 HTS is a comprehensive cruiser excelling in handling, smart interior layout, and a genuinely stylish and sporty exterior design.




































